Dental Summer Schools 2025

Do your students have an interest in, and the potential to, study dentistry at university?

The Dental Schools Council, with funding from NHS England, are offering Year 11 and Year 12 students the opportunity to attend a summer school to understand what it is like to study dentistry.

The summer schools are aimed at students from under-represented backgrounds who attend a state school or college.

Eligibility criteria

Eligibility criteria for the summer schools includes that the student is:

• From a widening participation background and

Academically:

- Has an interest in STEM subjects and are, or are considering, studying science in their post-16 studies and medicine post-18
- Has predicted A-level grades ABB (or equivalent) and
- Has predicted GCSE grades B or above in English and Mathematics (or equivalent)

Format and number of places

Run by universities, the summer schools, which are **free**, are delivered in a variety of formats, namely residential, commuter and online.

Four dental summer schools will run in 2025. There are 205 places at the residential and online dentistry summer schools.

If you feel that your student(s) match the eligibility criteria then please don't hesitate to let them know about the summer schools and encourage them to get their applications in before the deadline.

The deadline to apply for Dental Schools Council Summer Schools is 9 February 2025.

Applications for degree apprenticeships at engineering employers <u>AtkinsRéalis</u> and <u>Rolls-Royce</u> close in February.

Accounting & professional services firms <u>Deloitte</u>, <u>EY</u> and <u>KPMG</u> are recruiting now for their accounting, consulting and technology degree apprenticeships – and applications are open for programmes at investment bank <u>JPMorganChase</u> and retailer <u>Lidl</u>.

VetCam 2025 – Introduction to Veterinary Medicine at Cambridge University Monday 7th, Tuesday 8th and Wednesday 9th April 2025

Following the successful courses held here in recent years, we are holding another two-and-a-halfday residential programme for Year 11 and 12 students interested in applying to study Veterinary Medicine at Cambridge University.

The programme will include visits to both the pre-clinical and clinical departments to give a taste of the course, insight into life at a Cambridge college, and a chance to meet staff and current students. Places will be limited to 50 on a first-come-first-served basis. <u>Please note that Chemistry A level (or equivalent) is mandatory (with A*/A predictions), and we strongly recommend two other science subjects, normally Biology, Physics or Maths.</u>

The 2025 course fee will be £340 for the all-inclusive two-and-a-half-day course – this fee covers all costs whilst attendees are in Cambridge. Attendees will be staying in St Catharine's College in single student rooms with shared bathrooms.

We will keep an additional 10 names on a waiting list, in case of any cancellations. If a booking is cancelled, a £100 cancellation fee will be charged, and the remaining amount refunded. If you cancel within seven days of the start of the course none of the fee will be refunded.
