On Monday, year 12 Psychology and Health & Social Care students visited the Museum of the Mind at Bethlem Royal Hospital. Students had talks from the archivist on the history of mental health treatment in England, stretching all the way back to the 1300's. They then enjoyed a session looking at artwork produced by William Kurelek, a patient suffering from clinical depression and analysed what each part of the painting could represent relating to his battle with mental illness. Students then had a walk around the museum where they saw historical restraints, strait jackets and electroconvulsive therapy equipment which had all been used on real patients in the past.
