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Careers in Healthcare – Notley High School and Braintree Sixth Form Essential Info to get ahead!

What universities and Employers are looking for (write your application form/personal statement to address and evidence these where possible, with example. Expect to discuss more in interview) • Your passion, motivations and determination to do the role and/or course.

- Understanding of the role you are applying for including its challenges.
- Skills and Attributes Excellent communication (with a range of people/ages and situations)
- Team working
- Integrity and honesty
- Resilience
- Empathy and compassion
- Sensitive to others views
- Able to deal with difficult/challenging situations/work under pressure
- Be self-aware/reflecting (learn from mistakes/challenges)
- Non-judgemental
- Respectful
- Willingness to learn/be inquisitive

• Qualifications – make sure you keep your options open with A level (or equivalent) choices, but remember there are always other ways in. If doing medicine/dentistry – look at entrance exams and start practicing early.

Start Collecting Examples/Evidence that match skills needed above to support your application • Create opportunities (school/clubs) – volunteer and get involved with coaching, peer mentoring, student council etc. this is great for evidencing communication skills.

• Paid work – think about the transferable skills you gain from this and how they relate to what's required in the role.

• Volunteering – as above. Volunteering shows a lot about a persons willingness to give to others.

• Work experience – as above, but also think about the insights you have gained into the role/where it fits. The work experience may not match exactly because of opportunity, but it will have some connection/transferability at least.

• Research the role (including developments, news related to it, application of it (for clinical roles), regulation and governance). Speak to professionals in the field where you can to find out more. Really understand what it entails and how that differs (and connects to) from other roles. **Extended Project Qualification (in year 13)** – if you get a chance/can fit in an EPQ, consider focusing it on a topic related to your field.

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• Open days – attend university open days as these are a great way to not only find out about specific courses, and university facilities etc, but find out more about the professions. Remember, you don't have to intend to study locally to go to the open days!

• Taster days – Some universities have taster days you can sign up to. You don't have to have applied, or even intend to apply to book on, but they are a great way to find out much more and have a go at uni life/skills sessions/lectures etc. ARU run lots.

• Think about what transferable skills do you have/need still from the above? Go to step one again!
