
Sign in and out app

You should have all received an email from Sign In App Companion this week. This email contains a code that was valid for 72 hours and allows you to connect to the sign in app. This app allows you to sign in and out of the Sixth form as an alternative to using the Ipad at the entrance. You can sign in and out via either method. If you have not retrieved the code from the email in time or deleted the email by mistake, please let me know on return to the Sixth Form after Easter and we will contact IT about re issuing a code.
