Turing House Council

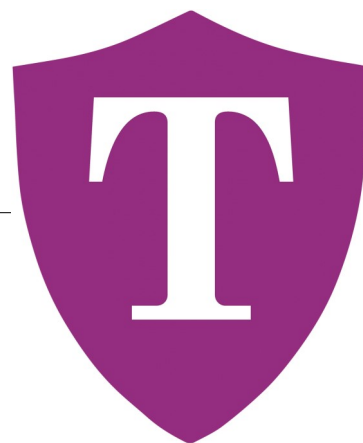
