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PDT CURRICULUM CONTENT FOR AUTUMN TERM 1

As a part of your child's education at Notley High School & Braintree Sixth Form, we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education programme delivered by tutors during PDT lessons. PSHE education is the curriculum subject that gives young people the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy, productive lives and meet their full potential.

The curriculum overview for PDT lessons during Autumn term 2 is as follows:

Year 7

Relationships and Sex Education: Students will be introduced to gender identity, sexuality and sex and will become familiar with the appropriate terminology. They will explore the changes that occur during puberty and ways to manage these. They will also look at the issues of unwanted contact, FGM and sending nudes.

Health and Wellbeing: Students will explore what mental wellbeing and self-esteem are and how these can be affected by negative influences around us (e.g. social media and body image).

Skills for Success: Students will by consider what revision is, why it is important and techniques for improving memory.

Year 8

Living in the Wider World: Students will learn about the Protected Characteristics. They will explore the difference between banter and bullying. They will learn the different types of bullying and what their responsibilities are if they witness (or believe someone is experiencing) bullying, including what to say and who to tell.

Health and Wellbeing: Students will learn basic first aid skills. They will learn who to contact, when, how and what information to give in an emergency.

Skills for Success: Students will consider how to create a positive learning environment in their own home. They will evaluate who they learn best with and will explore effective revision techniques

Year 9

Relationships and Sex Education: Students will explore healthy relationships including consent and the law. They will discuss what STIs are and how the spread can be reduced or prevented. Students will explore the range of contraceptives available and the pros and cons for each. They will also discuss issues around pornography.

Health and Wellbeing: Students will learn what cancer is and how to reduce the risk through simple lifestyle choices. They will discuss the facts and myths and identify the main signs and symptoms.

Skills for Success: Students will explore active revision techniques and learn how to plan a revision timetable.

Year 10

Careers: Students will identify and learn the skills required to present themselves in the best possible way and make a good impression at an interview. All students will complete a mock interview with a member of the local business community.

Skills for Success: Students will create a realistic revision timetable and recall effective revision techniques.

Year 11

Careers: Students will explore the laws that are in place to protect worker's rights. They will learn about sexual harassment in the workplace, including how to recognise and report it.

Relationships and Sex Education: Students will explore how to effectively communicate their wants and needs in relationships. They will discuss how to handle unwanted attention both on and offline. They will explore the various forms of domestic abuse and how to seek help for themselves and others. They will identify what a forced marriage is and how it is distinguished from an arranged marriage or other form of legal marriage. They will discuss where and how to seek support if they are concerned about themselves or someone they know.

As a school community, we are committed to working in partnership with parents/carers and we welcome any feedback that you may have.
