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PDT CURRICULUM CONTENT FOR SPRING TERM 2

As a part of your child's education at Notley High School & Braintree Sixth Form, we promote personal wellbeing and development through a comprehensive Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) education programme delivered in PDT lessons. PSHE education is the curriculum subject that gives young people the knowledge, understanding, attitudes and practical skills to live safe, healthy, productive lives and meet their full potential.

The curriculum overview for PDT lessons during Spring term 2 is as follows:

Year 7

Careers: Students will explore the meaning of 'career'. They will investigate employment sectors, using the school library and Unifrog, and identify some of the skills and qualities that would make someone suited to work in them. They will also explore how stereotyping can limit aspirations.

Staying Safe: Students will explore the effects on people who use of alcohol, smoking and vaping, caffeine and drugs and the law regarding possession, supply, and use.

Year 8

Careers: Students will explore the meaning of 'enterprise' and will develop their employability skills by working on a group project. They will consider how interests can link to our future career choices and the skills needed for these roles. Students will research different careers using the school library and Unifrog.

Year 9

Careers: Students will discuss career interests and pathways, linked to their personal skills and preferences, and use Unifrog to carry out research. They will explore their future career aspirations and the changing world of work, including the ways in which a person can be employed, and their rights and responsibilities in the workplace. They will also consider ways to protect their online reputation.

Year 10

Relationships and Sex Education 1: Students will explore the options available to people who wish to make a long-term commitment, including their legal rights. Students will discuss the different options for people wishing to start a family and identify the skills needed for successful parenting. Students will explore the options available in the event of an unintended pregnancy and the legal status of abortion.

Relationships and Sex Education 2: Students will explore the common myths and assumptions regarding sex and how these are perpetuated by pornography.

Year 11

Health and Wellbeing: Students will explore their responsibilities as they become more independent, in particular, safety, risk taking, emergency first aid and health. Students will discuss how to reduce the risk of developing many illnesses including, a number of cancers, through simple lifestyle choices and how to carry out testicular self-examination and breast self-examination.

Finance: Students will explore the important information contained on a payslip. They will explore different types of technology that support money management and how to choose a bank account, budget and plan for the future.

As a school community, we are committed to working in partnership with parents/carers and we welcome any feedback that you may have. Our Relationships and Sex Education Policy is on the school website.
