



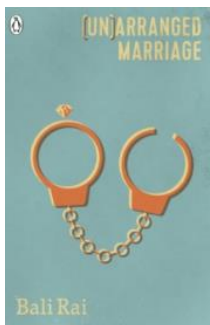

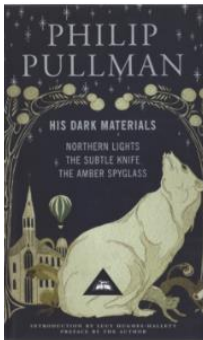

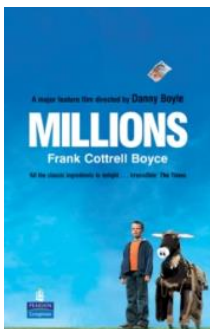
'(Un) Arranged Marriage' by Bali Rai

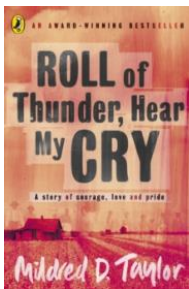
His Dark Materials by Philip Pullman

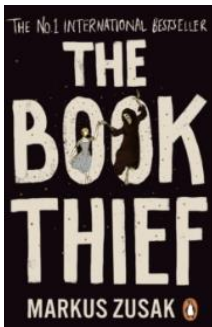
Stone Cold by Robert Swindells

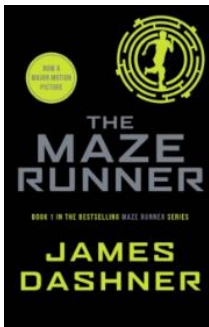
The 13th Reality Journal of Curious Letters by James Dashner

The Maze Runner by James Dashner

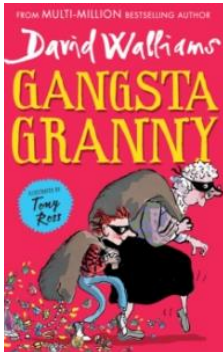

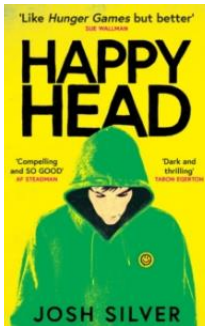
The Ghost Cat by Alex Howard

Follow Grimalkin the cat as he witnesses 120 years worth of changes in Edinburgh. A real feel-good book for any fan of humour and history.



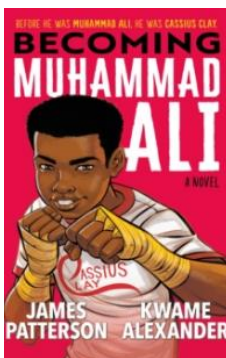
Glitter Boy by Ian Eagleton

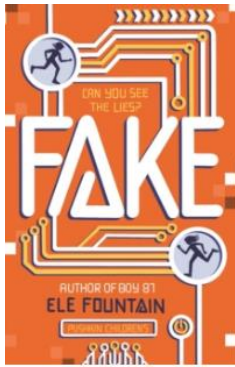
Happy Head by Josh Silver

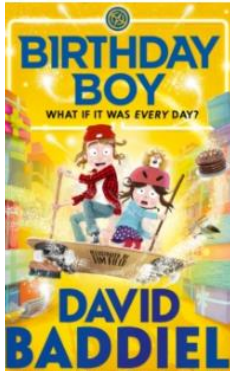
Becoming Muhammad Ali by James Patterson and Kwame Alexander

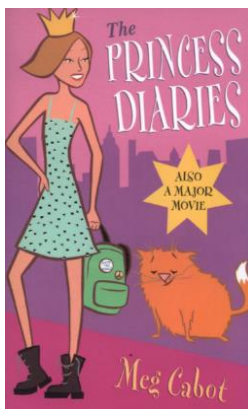
Fake by Ele Fountain

Birthday Boy by David Baddiel

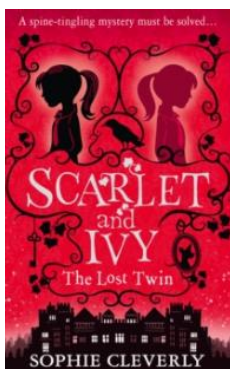

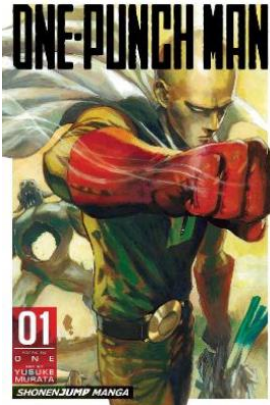
